KENYA TEA INDUSTRY PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS FOR FEBRUARY 2023 PRODUCTION

Tea production for the month of February 2023 dropped significantly by 8.22 Million Kgs to 32.73 Million Kgs from 40.95 Million Kgs recorded in during the same period of last year. Production during the month was also much lower compared to 54.91 Million Kgs recorded in January. Notably, this was the lowest production ever recorded during the month of February since the year 2020. Significant drop in production was occasioned by adverse sunny and dry weather conditions in most parts of the tea growing areas with exception of a few places in the West of the Rift Valley (Nandi, Kericho, and Bomet) that experienced occasional rainfall (few rain days). Temperatures were also high and above average consequent to which tea bushes in some of the tea growing areas experienced intense moisture stress, and in some instances, dried up.

As a result of dry weather conditions in most tea growing areas, output in the East of Rift droped by 4.26 Million Kgs from 15.90 Million Kgs recorded during the same month of 2022 to 11.64 Million Kgs. Similary, compared to February last year, production within the West of Rift was lower by 3.96 Million Kgs from 25.05 Million Kgs to 21.09 Million Kgs.

Across the sub-sectors, production within the smallholder was the most affected as the sub-sector is more wide-spread in areas that were adversely affected by drought, both in the East and West of Rift. The sub-sector recorded a significant drop of 7.69 Million Kgs from 24.46 Million Kgs recorded during the corresponding month of 2022 to 16.77 Million Kgs. However, decline in output within the Plantation sub-sector was only marginal at 0.53 Million Kgs from 16.49 Million Kgs to 15.95 Million Kgs as tea growing

areas in the West of Rift where the sub-sector is more widespread (Nandi, Kericho, and Bomet) received occasional but minimal precipitation.

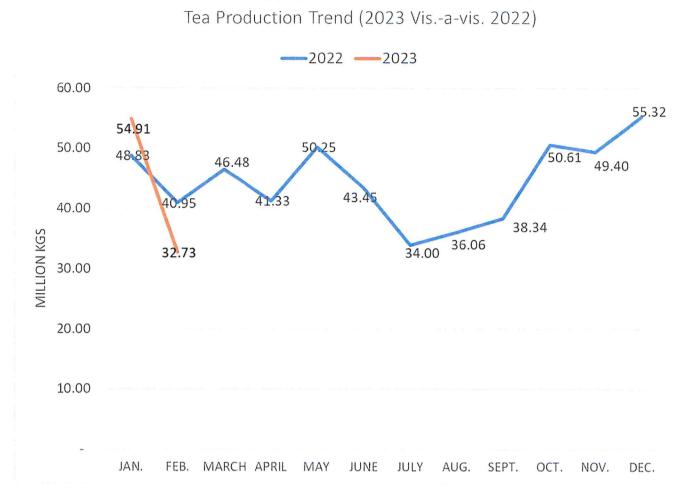

TEA SALES

AUCTION

During the month of February, auction sales volume for Kenya tea stood at 39.14 Million Kgs, which was lower compared to 45.34 Kgs Million recorded in the corresponding month of last year. However, the average monthly auction price for Kenya tea was lower at 2.31 USD per Kg against 2.71 USD for the same period of 2022. The average price was also lower compared to 2.33 USD recorded in the month of January this year.

During the month of February 2023, tea offered for sale by the smallholder tea factories fetched an average price of 2.64 USD per Kg for the main grades, which was lower compared to an average price of 2.97 USD recorded in February last year.

Lower sales volume and auction prices were due to the effect of economic recession facing the global markets especially Pakistan, Egypt, Sudan, and Russia, which are the largest markets for Kenya tea. The effect of global economic shock on auction volume and prices has been ongoing since the commencement of Russia-Ukraine crisis towards the end of February 2022. The crisis has affected global trading logistics leading to gradual increase in commodity prices and weakening of local currencies against the USD which in turn has affected consumer purchasing power and shortage of forex reserves within the markets.

EXPORTS

The total export volume for the month of February 2023 was lower by 33% (14.93 Million Kgs) from 45.12 Million Kgs recorded in the same period of last year to 30.18 Million Kgs. It was also lower compared to 32.72 Million Kgs exported during the month of January. Lower export volume was due to less imports by Pakistan, Egypt and Russia, whose combined volume of imports was less by 17.48 Million Kgs owing to challenges of forex reserves affecting these markets and shipping logistics occasioned by the effect of the Russia-Ukraine crisis. Compared to the previous months, tea exports to Pakistan in the month of February was affected significantly by tightened payment terms on all imports imposed by the Central Bank of Pakistan which was aimed at easing economic crisis triggered by shortage of foreign exchange.

During the month, Kenya tea was shipped to forty seven (47) export destinations compared to to fifty two (52) for the same period of last year. Despite payment challenges, Pakistan maintained its position as the leading export destination for Kenya

tea having imported 8.25 Million Kgs, which accounted for 27% of the total export volume. Other key export destinations for Kenyan tea were Egypt (4.07 Million Kgs), UK (3.70 Million Kgs), Iran (2.75 Million Kgs), UAE (2.39 Million Kgs), Yemen (1.29 Million Kgs), Afghanistan (1.20 Million Kgs), Russia (1.06 Million Kgs), Sudan (0.70 Million Kgs), and Jordan (0.56 Million Kgs). The top ten export destinations, majority of which are traditional markets for Kenyan tea accounted for 86% of Kenya tea export volume.

Apart from UK, Iran, UAE, Afghainistan, and Jordan the other traditional markets recorded less imports for Kenya tea. However, there was significant increase in exports to other traditional and emerging markets such as Ireland; Netherlands; Sri Lanka; Oman; Germany; Canada; and Indonesia. There were also a few shipments to seasonal markets such as Spain; Djibouti; Cote D'ivoire; Zambia; Israel Hong Kong; Burkina Faso; Japan; Mali; Australia; and Swaziland.

LOCAL TEA SALES

Local tea sales for February 2023 stood at 2.92 Million Kgs against 2.00 Million Kgs for the corresponding period of 2022 while cumulative tea sales for the two months period up to February 2023 was 5.94 Million Kgs against 4.63 Million Kgs for the same period of 2022.
